RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve a food service equipment contract award utilizing the Hospital Purchasing Services (HPS) cooperative program for Wyandot Middle School's cafeteria serving counter in the amount of \$149,806.22."

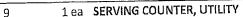

G.6 Approve Repair and Refinish of Gym Floor

Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve Allcourt, Inc. for the repair and refinish of Chippewa Valley High School's gymnasium floor in the amount of \$62,000.00."

RATIONALE: Aggressive pricing was previously obtained through the public bidding process RFP 20.1920 with the awarded and approved vendor going to Allcourt Inc. for wood gym floor finishing services. The gymnasium floor was damaged due to a water leak in a drinking fountain. Two quotes were obtained: (1) \$24,000 for the repair of the floor, which will be covered under insurance less the \$10,000 deductible, and (2) \$38,000 for the refinish of the entire floor so that it can blend in with the repair.

This proposal was reviewed and approved by the Maintenance and Purchasing Departments. Funding for this purchase will come from the 2023-2024 General Fund budget.

G.7 Approve Purchase of Elementary PRIME Science Curriculum Dr. Brosky

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the sole source provider, Activate Learning, for the adoption and implementation of PRIME Science for the elementary science curriculum for a total cost of \$349,154.88."

RATIONALE: Activate Learning is the sole provider for PRIME elementary science, which has been verified. The district has piloted PRIME science and has determined the best units to be taught at each grade level. It is a whole approach to science education that offers an extensive curriculum, an interactive digital platform, classroom kits, print student and teacher materials, and implementation support. The one-time cost to purchase consumables and kits includes professional development training. After the first year, an evaluation will determine the continued need for student workbooks.

The proposal was reviewed and approved by the Educational Services, Grants, and Purchasing Departments. Funding will come from the Student Intervention Fund for this purchase.
